EXEMPT RESEARCH CATEGORY 3

45 CFR 46 Preamble

Subpart D (children population) is not applicable Subjects must only be adults; although provision does not specify that adult subjects must be competent, tests of competency are not necessary, however subject subjects should not be exploited

If identifiers are maintained and disclosure would reasonably place subjects at risk, IRB conducts a limited IRB review (continuing review is not required for research approved under limited IRB review)

Definition of benign interventions: limited to behavior interventions (excludes medical tests, procedures, and devices); brief, harmless, painless, not physically invasive, not likely to have a significant lasting impact, will not be offensive or embarrassing to/for subjects

Category is *specifically* for *benign behavioral interventions in conjunction with the collection of information* from an *adult subject* through verbal or written responses or audiovisual recording if the subject prospectively agrees to the intervention and the information collection and at least one of three criterias are met

Use of deception must be authorized prospectively Allows recording of identifiable information directly or through identifiers linked to the subject, which requires a limited IRB review

Allows collection of data through audiovisual and video recording

EXEMPT RESEARCH CATEGORY 3

i) Research involving benign behavioral interventions in junction with the collection of information from an adult ject through verbal or written responses (including data entry) nudiovisual recording if the subject prospectively agrees to the ervention and information collection and at least one of the owing criteria is met:

- (A) The information obtained is recorded by the investigator in such a manner that the identity of the human subjects <u>cannot</u> readily be ascertained, directly or through identifiers linked to the subjects;
- (B) Any disclosure of the human subjects' responses outside the research would not reasonably place the subjects at risk of criminal or civil liability or be damaging to the subjects' financial standing, employability, educational advancement, or reputation; or
- (C) The information obtained is recorded by the investigator in such a manner that the identity of the human subjects <u>can</u> readily be ascertained, directly or through identifiers linked to the subjects, and an IRB conducts a limited IRB review to make the determination required by § __.111(a)(7).

ii) For the purpose of this provision, benign behavioral erventions are brief in duration, harmless, painless, not sically invasive, not likely to have a significant adverse lasting bact on the subjects, and the investigator has no reason to barrassing. Provided all such criteria are met, examples of such ign behavioral interventions would include having the subjects of an online game, having them solve puzzles under various se conditions, or having them decide how to allocate a nominal pount of received cash between themselves and someone else.

iii) If the research involves deceiving the subjects regarding nature or purposes of the research, this exemption is <u>not</u> <u>licable</u> <u>unless the subject authorizes the deception through a</u> <u>spective agreement</u> to participate in research in circumstances which the subject is informed that he or she will be unaware of nisled regarding the nature or purposes of the research.
