

DEEMED EXPORT QUESTIONNAIRE

International Visiting Scholars (J-1 Exchange Visitors)

Overview: UC Irvine and all members of the UC Irvine community are required by federal law to comply with U.S. export control laws, sanctions, and embargoes when hosting, employing or otherwise engaging with non-immigrant foreign nationals, such as hosting exchange visitors. This questionnaire collects critical information to conduct a compliance assessment of proposed visa petitions and/or activities of foreign nationals. This form should be completed and signed by the individual who will be supervising the visa beneficiary, or who is otherwise knowledgeable about the beneficiary's intended work. Please submit completed form and the visa beneficiary's CV/resume to the Export Control Office. It is incumbent upon the sponsoring department to notify the International Center and the Export Control Office of any material changes to the visa applicant's job duties, which would require filing an amended petition.

If the visa beneficiary is associated with a country of concern, then the Deemed Export Questionnaire Addendum must be completed by the visa beneficiary and submitted along with this form to the Export Control Office. "Associated with a Country of Concern" refers to individuals from a Country of Concern or currently enrolled at University in a Country of Concern, and individuals employed by an entity in a Country of Concern. The list of Countries of Concern (which can change) currently include: Democratic People's Republic of North Korea (North Korea), Islamic Republic of Iran, People's Republic of China including Hong Kong and Macau, Qatar, Russian Federation, Saudi Arabia, United Arab Emirates. Please see Countries of Concern for the current list.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Deemed Export: Any release of "technology" or source code subject to the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) to a foreign national. Such release is deemed to be an export to the home country or countries of the foreign national. This deemed export rule does not apply to persons lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States and does not apply to persons who are protected individuals under the Immigration and Naturalization Act (8 U.S.C. 1324b (a)(3)). Any release of any item to any party with knowledge a violation is about to occur is prohibited by Section 736.2(b)(10) of the EAR.

Development: "Development" is related to all stages prior to serial production, such as: design, design research, design analyses, design concepts, assembly and testing of prototypes, pilot production schemes, design data, process of transforming design data into a product, configuration design, integration design, layouts.

Export Control: The federal government's use of regulations and licensing requirements to manage exportation of commodities and information to countries outside the U.S.; manage the sharing of commodities and information with foreign nationals who are residing in the U.S.; and regulate travel to or activities involving sanctioned or embargoed countries.

Production: Means all production stages, such as: product engineering, manufacture, integration, assembly (mounting), inspection, testing, and quality assurance.

Technical Data: Information other than software, which is required for the design, development, production, manufacture, assembly, operation, repair, testing, maintenance, or modification of defense articles. This includes information in the form of blueprints, drawings, photographs, plans, documentation, instructions, models, formulae, tables, engineering designs and specifications, manuals and instructions written or recorded on other media or devices such as disk, tape, or read-only memories.

Technology: Specific information necessary for the "development," "production," or "use" of a commodity subject to the EAR. The information takes the form of "technical data" or "technical assistance."

Use: Operation, installation (including on-site installation), maintenance (checking), repair, overhaul, and refurbishing.
